NON-VERBAL REASONING - CLASSIFICATION(HINDI)

Q1: Arrange the following words in alphabetical order: Apple, Banana, Orange, Mango, Pineapple.

Long Method: To arrange these words alphabetically, we need to compare the first letters of each word. "Apple" starts with 'A', "Banana" also starts with 'A', "Orange" starts with 'O', "Mango" starts with 'M', and "Pineapple" starts with 'P'. Since 'A' comes before 'M', and 'M' comes before 'P', the alphabetical order is: Apple, Banana, Mango, Orange, Pineapple.

Short Method: The alphabetical order of the given words is: Apple, Banana, Mango, Orange, Pineapple.

Q2: Classify the following shapes into two categories: Circle, Triangle, Square, Rectangle, Pentagon, Hexagon.

Long Method: To classify these shapes, we need to identify their properties. Short Method: Curved Shapes: Circle, Hexagon Polygon Shapes: Triangle, Square, Rectangle, Pentagon

Q3: Divide the following animals into two groups: Dog, Cat, Lion, Giraffe, Elephant, Zebra.

Long Method: We can divide these animals based on their habitats or characteristics. Dog, Cat, Lion are carnivores, while Giraffe, Elephant, and Zebra are herbivores. So, one group can be Carnivores (Dog, Cat, Lion) and the other group can be Herbivores (Giraffe, Elephant, Zebra).

Long Method: To arrange these numbers in descending order, we compare each number with the others. The largest number is 92, followed by 87, then 54, 49, 36, and finally 23.

Short Method: Descending Order: 92, 87, 54, 49, 36, 23

Long Method: We can categorize these countries based on their geographical location. France is in Europe, Brazil is in South America, China is in Asia, Australia is in Oceania, Egypt is in Africa, and Canada is in North America.

Short Method: Europe: France South America: Brazil Asia: China Oceania: Australia Africa: Egypt North America: Canada

Q9: Classify the following vehicles into land, water, or air transportation: Car, Boat, Helicopter, Bicycle, Ship, Plane.

Long Method: We can classify these vehicles based on their primary mode of transportation. Car, Bicycle, and Helicopter are used on land, Boat and Ship are used in water, and Plane is used in the air.

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Short Method: Land Transportation: Car, Bicycle, Helicopter Water Transportation: Boat, Ship Air Transportation: Plane
